

JUDITH H. GERMANO is an Assistant United States Attorney for the District of New Jersey. Ms. Germano joined the Office in 2002 and currently serves as Chief of the Commercial Crimes Unit, where she focuses on corporate and bank fraud, identity theft and computer crimes. As an Assistant U.S. Attorney, Ms. Germano has investigated and prosecuted a number of fraud, political corruption and terrorism matters.

Prior to joining the U.S. Attorney's Office, Ms. Germano worked for several years at Shearman & Sterling, a large, multinational law firm based in New York City, where she handled numerous complex corporate litigation, white-collar criminal defense, internal corporate investigations, criminal and civil antitrust, international arbitration and bankruptcy matters. Before that, Ms. Germano served as a law clerk to the Honorable Joseph M. McLaughlin of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit and the Honorable Dominic J. Squatrito of the U.S. District Court for the District of Connecticut. Ms. Germano received her J.D. degree, with honors, from St. John's University School of Law, and her B.S. degree from Cornell University.

Ms. Germano has successfully investigated and prosecuted a variety of crimes, including corporate embezzlement, extortion, bribery, healthcare billing fraud, credit card fraud and export violations affecting national security. Ms. Germano also was the lead prosecutor in the investigation and prosecution of Sharpe James, the former mayor of Newark and a New Jersey State Senator, and his codefendant.
