Tom Yatsco is a Program Director for Highway and Transit Programs at the U.S. Department of Transportation's Office of Inspector General (OIG). He is responsible for directing the work of teams that audit and evaluate the Department's highway, transit, and rail programs. He is currently a lead for OIG's work on the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. At OIG, Tom has led reports and testimonies on key transportation issues, including Boston's Central Artery/Tunnel Project (the "Big Dig"), the National Bridge Inspection Program, the Dulles Corridor Metrorail Project, the Lower Manhattan Recovery Projects, Hurricane Katrina recovery efforts, and the New Starts transit investment program. He was previously a project manager at the U.S. Government Accountability Office (GAO), where he led studies on health care, government-wide, and intergovernmental issues. Before that, he was a policy coordinator for Medicaid and state health financing issues in the Immediate Office of the U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services and a health and long-term care policy analyst at the National Council on Aging. He holds a Master's degree from Kent State University and resides in Washington, D.C.
