Janice Mueller was appointed State Auditor by the leaders of the Wisconsin Legislature in March 1998, the first woman to serve in that capacity. In her role as State Auditor, Jan leads and directs the operations of the nonpartisan Legislative Audit Bureau, which conducts both financial audits and program evaluations of state agencies and programs.

Under her leadership, the Audit Bureau has released over 275 program and financial audits covering a wide array of state programs and agencies since 1998. The Legislative Audit Bureau has been nationally recognized as a leader in the field of financial auditing and program evaluation. In 2002, the Bureau received the National Legislative Program Evaluation Society's Award for Excellence in Evaluation in recognition of its adherence to the highest performance standards across a body of evaluative work. In addition, in both 2003 and 2006, the Legislative Audit Bureau received unqualified opinions on its financial auditing work from the National State Auditors Association.

In addition to her service as an ex-officio member of the Audit Committee of the State of Wisconsin Investment Board, Jan also serves in leadership roles in the National State Auditors Association, and as a member of the Advisory Board of the Accounting and Information Systems Department of the UW-Madison School of Business. In recognition of her achievements and her commitment to public service, Jan was named a 2004 recipient of the *Wisconsin's First Woman* award by Wisconsin Women in Government.

Carole M. Doeppers is an independent consultant specializing in data privacy, fair information practices, and privacy policy development. Carole is the former director of the Wisconsin Data Privacy Project whose objective was to examine the implications of technology on privacy and other civil liberties. In 1993, she was appointed to serve as Wisconsin's first State Privacy Advocate. By statute she was responsible for informing citizens about their privacy rights and developing government policies and procedures to safeguard personal and data privacy. The Office of the Privacy Advocate and its advisory Privacy Council were eliminated in the 1995 biennial budget. As a result, Carole Doeppers is one of very few Americans ever to have served in such a capacity.

Throughout her career, Carole has never been far removed from the fields of applied ethics and public policy. While working for the State Ethics Board in the early 1980s, she advised public officials how to avoid conflicts of interest. After earning a graduate degree from the UW-Madison La Follette Institute of Public Policy, specializing in administrative law, she accepted a position as Assistant Administrator to the UW Clinical Sciences Center's Human Subjects Committee. It was in this position that she became involved in patient confidentiality and related issues associated with medical and computer ethics.

Carole Doeppers has testified extensively before legislative committees and has published several reports on data-handling practices and electronic government. She has also written and spoken on a wide variety of topics including regulatory compliance, genetic privacy, Internet ethics and theft of identity.

Doeppers has served on both the Madison and Dane County Ethics Boards, the latter position on which she currently serves. She is also on the Board of Directors of the Center for Family Policy and Practice and the UW Credit Union.
